Our History



St Francis de Sales was established in 1961 by the Sisters of Charity to serve the Oak Park Community. The school was named after St Francis de Sales who was dedicated to the church and demonstrated how to live the everyday life in the image of Christ. He was a model of holiness and lived a life that was amiable and friendly which continues to be reflected in our community today.

The school was housed in 4 classrooms situated alongside the Parish Church. The school now consists of eleven classrooms, a library, parish hall, and a staffroom and work area for teachers.

In 2010, we undertook a major building project, adding a new, state of the art educational wing comprising of a library, amphitheatre, resource/ planning space and three large, dynamic, flexible learning spaces. We are always looking to maintain and develop our grounds and facilities to provide the most positive learning environments we can for our students. In 2019 we have 12 classes consisting of 2 classes of Grade Prep, 4 Grade 1/2s, 3 Grade 3/4s and 3 Grade 5/6s.

Curriculum

From Prep to Year 4 the curriculum at St Francis de Sales focuses on developing the fundamental knowledge, skills and behaviours in literacy and numeracy and other areas including physical and social capacities which underpin all future learning.

In Years 5 and 6 students build on these foundations. An expanded curriculum program provides the basis for in depth learning within and across all subject areas.

Digital Technology

SFds believes that best practice in education includes the use of learning technology to support learning. As such we are committed to using digital technology to help to develop future focused competencies and skills sets that will serve and support our students in their future.

Digital technology is used across the curriculum with the school following the Victorian Curriculum Digital Technology scope and sequence of learning.

- In-class programs supporting cyber safety and use of technology
- Use of technology to support assessment of student learning needs across the school
- State of the art virtual environment including ICT support on site.

Anaphylaxis and Allergy Policy

St Francis de Sales Primary School's priority is the safety and well-being of all our students. Many of you will know someone who is affected by anaphylaxis, a life threatening allergic reaction.

St Francis de Sales has a number of students who live with the risk of anaphylaxis to foods. Whilst these children are being taught to care for themselves at an age appropriate level, we ask that you help us educate your child on the importance of not sharing food with others, washing hands after eating and calling out to an adult if they think their friend with allergies is sick.

With increased awareness and understanding of anaphylaxis, you will be able to help protect those around you.

The school also asks that all parents *carefully* consider the foods they place in their child's lunch box each day.

Minimising foods such as *Peanuts, Tree Nuts and Sesame* can greatly reduce the chance that ANY student in our school is exposed to foods that they are allergic to.

Our school does its best to be an allergy aware school. Staff have had training in severe allergy management and we have implemented many strategies to help keep students at risk of anaphylaxis as safe as we can.
